The House is expected to consider the House Amendment to Senate Amendments to [H.R. 695](#) – Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2018 (Rep. Granger – Appropriations) (Subject to a Rule).

The House will recess no later than 5:00 p.m. and reconvene at approximately 8:35 p.m. for a Joint Session with the Senate for the purposes of receiving an address from the President of the United States. Members are requested to be on the Floor and seated no later than 8:20 p.m.
