The House is expected to complete consideration of H.R. 4293 - Stress Test Improvement Act of 2017 (Rep. Zeldin - Financial Services) and H.R. 4061 -Financial Stability Oversight Council Improvement Act of 2017 (Rep. Ross - Financial Services). The House is expected to begin consideration of H.R. 4790 – Volcker Rule Regulatory Harmonization Act (Rep. Hill – Financial Services) (Subject to a Rule) and H.J.Res. 2 – Proposing a balanced budget amendment to the Constitution of the United States (Rep. Goodlatte – Judiciary) – under suspension of the Rules.
