The House is expected to consider <u>H.R. 3144</u> – To provide for operations of the Federal Columbia River Power System pursuant to a certain operation plan for a specified period of time, and for other purposes (Rep. McMorris Rodgers – Natural Resources) (Subject to a Rule). The House is also expected to begin consideration of <u>H.R. 4</u> – FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018 (Rep.
