"... [D]ays ago, President Donald Trump promised House Republicans he'd have their backs '1,000 percent' on immigration. On Friday, he told them to 'stop wasting their time' — putting GOP leaders in an impossible position and throwing the conference into chaos. But House Republican leaders say they plan to forge ahead with an immigration vote... nonetheless. [House] Speaker Paul Ryan's [R-WI] team has spent weeks trying to strike an accord between moderate Republicans from swing districts and conservatives... But if Ryan holds the vote, the result could be catastrophic. GOP members who thought they could support the bill have already started telling leadership that they will no longer vote for it... That means the bill likely would fail in spectacular fashion on the House floor, which would be a huge embarrassment to leadership and an affront to the rank in file who have spent hundreds of hours in negotiations."
