The Rules Committee has recommended a closed Rule that provides for one hour of debate on the motion equally divided and controlled by the Chair and Ranking Member of the Committee on Ways and Means. The Rule waives all points of order against consideration of the motion. **Members are urged to <u>VOTE NO</u>**.
