## **TOMORROW'S OUTLOOK**

The GOP Leadership has announced the following schedule for Wednesday, September 6: **The House** will meet at 10:00 a.m. for legislative business. The House is expected to consider H.R. — Making supplemental appropriations for disaster relief requirements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017 — under suspension of the Rules. The House is also expected to consider H.R. 3388 — SELF DRIVE Act (Rep. Latta — Energy and Commerce) — under suspension of the Rules. Lastly, the House is expected to begin consideration of H.R. 3354 — "Make America Secure and Prosperous Appropriations Act, 2018" (Rep. Frelinghuysen — Appropriations) (Subject to a Rule).

"Congress gets back to work Tuesday in what may be a mad scramble to avoid several fiscal crises. Unless a stopgap funding measure is passed by month's end, a government shutdown looms. Unless the debt ceiling is raised or suspended within the same time frame, the government risks a default. And unless lawmakers pick up their usually sluggish pace, victims of Hurricane Harvey could be denied relief aid they need soon. It all adds up to an unpredictable and likely chaotic fall legislative session that will test the ability of GOP leaders to steer clear of fiscal catastrophe and prove they can govern."
